Christmas Picture Books


Next week in class, each year group will be looking at a different Christmas picture book. They will then use this book, alongside scripture, to retell the story of the First Christmas.

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Nursery

Nursery have had a week of excitement, nerves and pride. It really took a lot for the children to stand on stage and perform in front of so many people. It is not easy to remember the words to all of those songs, remember when to speak and where to stand. We are incredible proud of all of them.

In class, we have been reading and sequencing the Christmas story, thinking and talking about how Mary and Joseph would have felt. The frost this week has been lovely to explore. We noticed track marks outside, and went to find frosty leaves in the forest, talking about why the frost disappeared by the time we got the leaves back to our classroom. The crunch of the grass under our feet brought lots of excitement too.

Reception

WOW! What a week. We cannot put into words how proud we are of the Reception children! They all performed so well in their Christmas play...their singing, dancing and acting was amazing in all 3 performances and the whole team are so so proud! You very much deserved the popcorn and movie afternoon!

In maths we have been completing Christmas based activities, ordering different sized baubles and finding answers to Christmas puzzles. In Literacy we have started our work on The Gingerbread man.

Question: What rhyme is repeated in The Gingerbread man story?

Newsletter -

Year 1

We have had a lovely week preparing for our Christmas Carol performance and on Thursday the children were a credit to you and our school. They shared the true mening of Christmas through word and song.

In RE we have been focussing on our theme of Advent and thinking about what it is like to wait for something special to happen. We also spent time looking at the Advent wreath and how that can help us prepare for Jesus' birth.

In English we have started our new book "The Grinch Who Stole Christmas" and after hearing most of the story the children were asked to write questions for the Grinch. The children use different question starters like who, what, when and why.

In maths we have been learning to recognise and name 3d shapes and we sorted them by criteria such as flat faces, curved faces, stackable and not stackable. We will continue to develop our understanding through our continuous provision next week. We were pleased to see good scores in this weeks mental arithmetic tests and would continue to encourage you to use Hit the button amd Numbots to keep skills sharp.

In science we have been learning about the season of Winter. We have been finding out about how animals prepare for the season.

Can you find some 3d shapes at home or in the environment?

Year 2

The superstars of Year 2 have ended the week by performing their Nativity, 'Lights, Camel, Action'! We are so proud of the hard work that has gone into the practises for our performance and every single child was fantastic! A big well done Year 2.

Alongside practising for our Nativity, the children have started their new book in English, 'Little Robin Red Vest'. We have talked about how Little Robin was full of the Christmas spirit and we talked about the important meaning behind this story. As well as this, we have been writing in the past tense and using regular and irregular past tense verbs. In Maths, we have been adding to the next multiple of ten and subtracting across a ten. We have been talking about Advent and how we can prepare for Christmas. Every day, we have been watching a video from the Jesse Tree and discussing its importance during Advent

Question: How was Little Robin full of the Christmas spirit?

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Year 3

This week in year 3 we have continued our learning on the 'Truth Pixie'. The children have planned and written newspaper reports about the disappearance of the Truth Pixie. They have also worked on expanded noun phrases using parts of the story to help.

In maths, the children have been working on multiplying and dividing by 3 and 4. We have done this in different ways including interactive activities on the interactive board.

In RE we have begun our advent unit on 'Visitors'. The children have researched the meaning and the origins of the Jesse Tree.

In Art, the children have completed their unit on the 'Great Wave'. At the start of the week, the children had to sketch their own version of the image. In the next lesson, the children had to outline a bigger version of this artwork before painting. The children had to colour mix using blue, black and white to create different tones of blue to paint the waves.

Question- What is Jess Tree and how is it used around Christmas time?

Year 4

This week, we well and truly got into the Christmas spirit! We were treated to nativity performances from Nursery, Reception and Year Two. Everyone really enjoyed themselves and we would like say a big well done to all the children involved. Their dancing and singing was great!

In English, we have been continuing our work on 'A Christmas Carol'. We have been learning the difference between simple past and present perfect tense and how to use this in our writing. The children have been getting into character and reflecting on all of the mistakes Scrooge made in his past.

On Monday, we took part in a virtual assembly delivered by STEM. We discussed sustainability for the future and what steps we can take to help look after our planet.

Question: Can you explain the difference between simple past tense and present perfect tense?

Year 5

On Monday, we took part in an interactive science workshop. We were tasked with helping to develop a carbon zero factory. The children worked collaboratively in groups to develop a factory in the most eco friendly way possible. The children were also fascinated about the role of an engineer and some have even been inspired to become engineers themselves.

In RE this week, we concluded our unit on 'Life Choices' by writing a Marriage booklet, detailing hymns, prayers and vows. We have also continued to enjoy the stories of the Jesse tree from Creation to Christmas as we prepare for the birth of Jesus. Next week, we will focus on Advent, recounting the Nativity and using our creative and drama skills to empathise with those who witnessed Jesus' birth.

In Guided Reading, we analysed the lyrics to songs - identifying themes, looking for hidden meaning and making comparisons between the beginning and end of the song.

As part of our unit on fractions, we have learned how to convert improper fractions to mixed numbers and vice versa. We have used images to support our learning, progressing to using the formulae of multiplication and division.

Question - Who were Abraham and Sarah and why are they important?

Year B

We began the week with an interactive science workshop where we assisted on developing a carbon zero factory. The children were engaged and carefully considered the most eco friendly way of developing a factory. We loved learning about the job of an engineer- a few children have been inspired!

We have absolutely loved the Christmas performances from the children lower down in the school. They really got us into the Christmas spirit whilst reminding us that the true meaning of Christmas is Jesus. Thank you Nursery, Reception and Year 2!

In Maths, we have continued our work on fractions. We have looked at equivalent fractions, simplifying fractions and comparing fractions. The children have been showing great resilience in class when solving problems with fractions.

In Letters from the Lighthouse, we learnt about plans to destroy the town lighthouse. We have considered the pros and cons of the lighthouse and have began to plan and write a persuasive letter to either support the destruction or oppose it.

In our Science lesson, we have researched the different classes of vertebrates and discussed the similarities and differences between the classes.

Question: If the numerator of a fraction is 1, what is the name of the fraction?
