A MESSAGE FROM MR LAVIN...

I hope you are all well and you have had a great week.

This week started with us reflecting on Jesus' baptism, we talked about our own baptisms and how this is the start of our mission - the start of our faith journey. It's been lovely to see some of the children's pictures from their own baptisms too.

Sweep the sheds

During Assembly, I introduced children to one of our new 'world class behaviours' - sweep the sheds. This means that we are all responsible for keeping our school looking clean and tidy. Thank you to the children for working hard this week in making sure litter is put in the bins and the school is tidy. These small actions make a huge difference - always remember 'sweep the sheds'.

Year 1 and 2

It was lovely to celebrate mass with our Year 1 and 2 classes this week. Father talked to the children about the importance of prayer and asked the children who they could pray for. Their kind and considerate answers were lovely to hear. As always, their behaviour and singing was amazing.

A few gentle reminders:

- Long hair (below shoulder length) should be tied back for boys and girls.
- Jewellery including digital smart watches, rings, bracelets should not be worn.
- Any bows/headbands in hair should be small and in the school colours of red, white, blue or black.
- Crowns, tiaras, headbands with ears and other headpieces should not be worn.
- Earrings should be stud only. This is for health and safety reasons. Children will be asked to remove them or plasters given to cover if they are not studs please ensure these are taken out before children come to school to help.
- Make up should not be worn, this includes nail varnish and false nails. I appreciate that nails may be painted on weekends for parties/shows etc, but this should be removed before school.

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



This week our Year 6 children had their retreat day with Mrs Farmer. The focus of the day was- what does it mean to be faith filled? The children reflected upon how their faith impacts the choices they make day to day. They explored different ways of praying and participated in song and meditation.

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We have had a fun filled this week. We launched with our new exciting book - Naughty Bus! The children have loved the pictures and the adventures the Naughty Bus gets up to. Nursery received their own Naughty Bus, so watch this space to see what adventures that gets up to.

In maths we have been learning all about the number 1. We have been counting, recognising, drawing and representing everything to do with the number one. We have used the Numberblocks to help us with our learning. In RE we have had a focus on our school mission statement which is about Love, and treating each other with love and compassion just as Jesus taught us.

Our home corner theme is washing and cleaning this half term. We have been looking at the important of sweeping and mopping in the home - the children loved being able to sweep up and even had a go at mopping!

Reception

This week in Maths, we have been consolidating our number knowledge to 5. It is fantastic to see how embedded their learning is. The children are subitising up to 5 confidently. We have also been learning about I less, the significance of zero and comparing numbers using words such as more and less.

We have started our new text "The Train Ride". The children are enjoying the story and making connections with journeys that they have experienced. Thank you for sending in junk modelling materials. The children are excited about exploring materials and making their own trains. The children's writing skills are developing as they begin to write simple sentences. We are now introducing a number of red words that are tricky. This week we have been looking at the red words they have been looking at the red words.

The home corner is now themed around fixing things. We have been talking about different occupations such as plumbers, builders and decorators.

Year 1

Happy New Year to you all. We have had a great start to the new term and the children have settled well into their established routines. In english this week we have started a new book called "Unplugged" by Steve Anthony. The children have been writing predictions and learning about the prefix "un" and suffixes "ing" and "ed". We have also been assessing our knowledge of phonic sound learned so far. In Maths we have been developing our place value knowledge of numbers within twenty. We have also been keeping our skills sharp with our fluency practice.

In RE we completed our understanding of the nativity by learning about the Epiphany and started our new topic about "Special People". We celebrated Mass yesterday and the children behaved very respectfully.

In Art we have been learning about primary and secondary colours. We have looked at the work of Henri Matisse with a view to creating our own paintings. We have been busy preparing our assembly for next week and look forward to seeing you there.

Question: What are the primary and secondary colours?

Year 2

Happy New Year to all members of 2LS, 2AL and their families. The children have settled back well.

This week, in English, we have started the study of a new book called, 'Lizzie and The Birds'. The children have been excited to look at the different birds and have been deciding which ones are their favourite. One or two of them may have even popped into our classroom.

In Maths, we have continued to work on our addition and subtraction skills as well as continuing with our NCETM activities.

In Religion, we have started our next unit which is based around books and scripture. The children have considered different types of books and their importance.

In Geography, we have continued to explore the different continents and seas of our world and will study similarities and differences between them.

Finally, on Thursday we attended our Year 1 and 2 Mass. The children created a prayerful atmosphere and were very respectful.

Year 3

Welcome back to the first full week of 2023. The children this week have started lots on new units of work across the curriculum.

In English the children are working really hard on their book of 'Tin Forest'. The children have used prepositional language to describe an image from the story as well as editing parts of the story.

In maths the children have been working hard on their multiplication skills when multiplying 2 digit numbers by 1 digit. We have looked at this with exchanging and they have taken to the method really well.

In Science we have begun our new unit of 'Plants'. The children have made plants out of card and labelled all of the parts in their books.

In RE the children have completed the first couple of lessons on the new unit of 'Life is a Journey'. They have thought about 2022 and the impact last year has had on their life.

In Spanish the children have been learning about fruits and how to accurately pronounce the words.

Question- In Spanish how do you say: orange, pear and cherry?

Year 4

Happy New Year from all in Year Four!

Since our return from Christmas break, we have been talking to the children about their opportunity for a new beginning. While discussing their New Year's resolutions, the children shared the high expectations they have for themselves and the positive changes that they hope to make. We can't wait to see the amazing things they achieve in 2023.

So far this term, we have retold the story of the Epiphany, celebrated the life of Pope Benedict XVI, studied the work of local scientist John Dalton and began learning about what a river is. In addition to this, we have begun our new unit of work in English which is based around the book 'The Promise' and continue to practise our multiplication and division skills in Maths.

Question: What name is given to the end of a river?

Year 5

The first full week of 2023 has abrough a new topic in English. We have started to watch and study the film Chak De! India. Everyone is loving the new topic. In it we have discussed our predictions about the film by analysing the front cover; summarised the opening scenes; created different types of sentences based on what we have seen so far; and used show not tell sentences to describe characters.

In maths, we have continued our fractions unit. Our focus has been on the addition of fractions first working with common denominators before moving onto activities with different denominators.

We have started our latest topic in religious education - mission. For this we have explored the origins of the The Richmond Fellowship (a mental health charity) and the missions of local charities and significant national charities.

Year B

This week both Year 6 classes have had the opportunity to participate in their RE retreat with Mrs Farmer. Please see the RE information page for more detail regarding this.

In Maths, we have been continuing to work on fractions. This week we have focused on improper and mixed number fractions. The children have been applying their multiplication and division skills to help them convert between the two. We have also learnt strategies for adding mixed number fractions.

In English, we have started reading our new text 'Wonder'. Both classes have been extremely excited to read this- we even had some cheering! We have focused on the main character, Auggie, and considered the pros and cons of him attending school. We have been reading the remaining chapters of 'Letters from the Lighthouse' in
