Nursery

This week the children have worked extremely hard practicing their Nativity performance. Please keep learning any lines and songs at home.

The children are at the Imitation stage of their talk for writing sessions in our book "WOW said the owl." In Maths we have been learning about AB patterns and the children are excited to progress to ABC patterns next week.

In forest school this week the children planted a bean and then went into the forest where they were given a piece of dogwood to use as a magic wand as in the winter it glows red. The children got really creative and were turning their friends into frogs, dogs, cats and bunny rabbits.

On Monday we have our owl visit. We have spoken to the children about being quiet around the owls and how they must listen to instructions to ensure the owls stay safe.

Reception

The children in Reception have been working so hard, especially in Literacy. We have innovated our story "Room on the Broom." The children decided to change the witch to Father Christmas who lost his presents! The children were amazing when retelling their innovated version. Well done, Reception! In maths, we have been working hard to learn how numbers 1-5 are made up. We have been thinking about how the smaller numbers (parts) are added together to make the whole.

In RE we took part in Baptism service of Baby Stephen. We took on different roles (parents, Godparents, Priest, congregation) and enjoyed this very special sacrament.

Next week will be the start of our "celebration" topic. We are excited to begin our new text "Jesus' Christmas Party."

Year 1

The children have been working through their termly assessments in maths, reading, spelling and writing. They have worked hard and we are proud of their efforts. We started our new Geography topic, looking at the United Kingdom. The children were able to locate countries and seas.

In RE we concluding our Baptism topic by sharing what we had learned. The children remembered many of the rituals and symbols of the sacrament.

In maths we continue to work on our mental maths and to develop our understanding of addition and subtraction. We can see many scores improving by the end of the week.

Our Rainbow Challenges are being completed independently by many of the children and we are pleased to see their resilience when working alone. We finished the week by celebrating Mass with Year 2 and 3.

Year 2

This week, we have been completing our termly assessments and we are so proud of the children's resilience! They have worked extremely hard and we are so proud of the progress that the children are making in all areas.

We started off the week by completing our Art unit and the children produced some beautiful observational drawings of the items that they collected in the forest last week.

In English, we have started reading a Christmas text, Little Robin Red Vest. The children have explored how Little Robin is full of the Christmas spirit and they have been analysing the key features of a letter. They have even written their own letters to Father Christmas that have been sent off to the North Pole!

In Maths, we have been building on the skill of addition by making 10, and we have applied this knowledge to solve addition with 3 single digit numbers.

In R.E, we have looked at the order of a Baptism and discussed any that we have been to. We ended the week with a lovely Mass and all the children were beautifully behaved.

Question: What is the most efficient way to solve 6 + 9 + 4?





Year 3

This week in Year 3 we have been working hard to complete our assessments in English and Maths.

In our English unit we completed our unit on 'Stone Age Boy' by writing a non-chronological report. Our History learning also helped the children to write an informative and knowledge-rich text.

In Art, we compared a modern artist's use of charcoal when portraying dogs with the work of Degas. Next, we looked in detail at Stone Age cave paintings found in caves in Europe and South America. Using charcoal, the children created their own cave pictures including handprints and figures.

In Geography, we looked at the countries which make up the United Kingdom. The children studied maps which showed the main cities; the seas around the UK and its rivers. On Friday, our mass had the theme of Prayer. Ten Year 3 children did the readings in church. They read clearly and confidently.

Question: What is the capital of Wales?

Year 4

In year 4 this week it has been assessment week. The children have been tested on their reading abilities through a reading paper alongside their STAR reading test. In maths the children have been assessed through a maths paper as well as a STAR math test. For their writing skills, the children have worked on a paper that tested their grammar, punctuation and spelling. The children have done brilliantly and some of the scores highlight just how hard we have worked this term!

In English we have drafted and published our biography writing on the life of Amanda Gorman. The finished products look brilliant!

In maths this week we have a big push again on our times tables and worked hard on improving our knowledge.

In Geography we have continued our unit on rivers. We have looked at rivers from around the world alongside rivers from Manchester.

We have looked this week at using our Happy Breathing to calm us down when we are in a state of stress, anxiousness or anger. The children have really enjoyed this.

Question- what do we call the part of the river that meets the sea?





Newsletter

Year 5

This week has been assessment week across school.

In year 5, the children have approached all of the assessments in a mature manner, working hard to apply their understanding and showing resilience and focus. We are incredibly proud of their achievements!

In English, we have continued our learning around Room 13, planning and beginning to write the missing chapter from the book. We will continue to work on these pieces of writing next week, editing and improving our work and publishing our final pieces.

Our new unit of work in Maths is fractions. The children have completed work on finding unit and non-unit fractions and using models and images to recognise equivalent fractions, before moving on to converting improper fractions to mixed numbers and vice versa.

As part of our Typography and Maps unit in Art, the children used cut-out shapes to create their own fonts and explored using household items, such as screws, nuts and bolts, to create and sketch their own letters. Next week, we will develop our sketching skills using maps and newspaper print as a base for our imagery.

In RE, we used historical paintings to explore the topic of friendship. The children identified important qualities of a good friend and produced a creative piece of work of their own demonstrating friendship.

Question - What are the three most important qualities in a friend?

Year 6

We've had another jam packed week in Year 6! In English, we have continued reading `Letters from the Lighthouse'. We have been analysing what writing and grammatical features make a narrative exciting. Our grammar focus has been punctuating direct speech and next week we will be integrating dialogue into a small section of narrative.

In Maths, we have been continuing to work through fractions. This has involved multiplying and dividing fractions by integers and other fractions. We have also looked at finding part of a whole, as well as finding the whole when given a part.

In RE, we have concluded our work on Judaism by looking at Yom Kippur. We loved how this is a charitable time and thought about how we could be more charitable in our own lives.

We were excited to begin a new reading project in class. We will be reading 'A Christmas Carol' in our reading sessions which is an extremely challenging text. Thank you to Mr Lavin who has purchased a copy of the text for each child!
