Next week we will be consolidating our learning on everything we have learnt this term. Please refresh their memories by completing this week's homework.

We have created lots of christmas crafts this week and will finish them to come home next week. In RE we are continuing to look at Advent. We have discussed what advent is, the nativity story and how and why we celebrate Christmas.

Just a few dates to remember for next week: **Wednesday (20th)** is Christmas Dinner Day. **Thursday (21st)** is our class party so children can come to school dressed in their party clothes. **Friday (22nd)** iis the last day of term and children finish at 1.30pm.

Reception

What a week! We can't put into words how proud we are of the children! Three nativity performances and they were fabulous in each and every one of them! Hollywood here we come!

Thank you to all who took time to message with such lovely words, we have read them all to the children which they loved!

Next week is our final week before we finish for the Christmas break. We will finish our story "Jesus' Christmas Party" and complete our Christmas crafts and surprises! In Maths we will finish our 1 more/less unit and recap numbers 1-5 and how they are made up.

Just a few dates to remember for next week: **Tuesday (19th)** is our party in the forest - all children will need wellies and a waterproof coat with a hood. **Thursday (21st)** is our class party so children can come to school dressed in their party clothes. **Friday (22nd)** is whole school mass and children finish at 1.30pm.

We are really looking forward to a great last week of term.

Year 1

The children in Year 1 have had a fantastic week! We are so proud of their performances in the Christmas Carol service, they worked very hard and put on a lovely show.

This week, the children have been working hard on their weekly challenges and are showing increasing skill in working independently. We have now finished our shape work in Maths, by sorting 2D and 3D shapes and building patterns. In English, we have been working on our descriptive language use, and the children have been writing sentences based on a setting from our focus book 'The Winter's Child'. In RE, we have been re-telling the Annunciation story, as well as working in groups to consolidate learning surrounding Baptism and Advent. The children have been producing some lovely Christmas crafts, and we look forward to continuing this next week. **Reminder:** Year 1 have their forest school disco on **Monday 18th December**. Please could a pair of wellies and a spare pair of socks be provided if they haven't already.

Year 2

What a big week for Year 2! This morning, the children performed their Christmas Nativity and they did a fantastic job! All the staff in Year 2 are so proud of all the children for how well they have learnt their lines, practised the songs and how they have put 100% effort into the rehearsals to make it a fantastic show for all their parents to see! We hope that you all enjoyed it and we are sure that you are all bursting with pride!

In class, the children have finished their Baptism unit and they have been explaining the symbolism of different signs and symbols used. Next week, the children will complete their Advent unit and retell the story of the First Christmas.

In English, the children have been preparing for writing their own narrative in the style of Little Robin Red Vest. They have analysed the emotions of characters in the story and identified the key moments. The children have re-capped using subordinating conjunctions and they wrote a detailed setting description including them.

Year 3

Another exciting week in Year 3!

In English we have continued with our book 'The Dark.' The children had to write a thank you letter to the Dark, thanking him for his gift. We also read our linking story - 'The King Who Banned the Dark.'

In Maths, the children are becoming more confident in tackling addition and subtraction of two and three digit numbers. They also learnt their four times table together and have been practising it at speed.

In RE, we have begun to look at the significance of Advent as a time of preparation and waiting for Jesus. The children had to think about how we prepare when we are expecting visitors at home - the demands and also the joys of welcoming them.

The highlight this week has to have been our Forest Schools Party on Monday afternoon. The children danced and sang and then enjoyed a hot chocolate drink in the forest.

Question: Think of two things that happened when Jesus was baptised.

Year 4

Another busy week has passed and we now edge very close to our winter break. This week in year 4 we have moved onto reading and working on the famous novel 'A Christmas Carol'. We have looked in depth at the character of Scrooge and wrote descriptions using higher level vocabulary. The children have really enjoyed the story so far and we will continue this next week.

In math we have looked at using our multiplication skills to multiply 3 digits by 1 in the written method. We have also continued to practise our multiplication and division skills. In RE we have continued our Advent work. We have looked at the meaning behind 'Gaudete Sunday'. We have also looked at the Christmas Story from the perspective of the Three Wise Men and the significance of the gifts that they presented to Jesus at his birth. A brilliant part of our week was our 'Forest School Fun Afternoon' on Thursday where the children danced, partied and drank hot chocolate.

Question- What words would you use to describe Scrooge in the opening chapters of 'A Christmas Carol'?

Year 5

Another busy week here in Year 5!

In Maths this week, the children have continued to develop their understanding of our Fractions unit with focus on mixed numbers and improper fractions. Although the children found this difficult at first, they have persevered with this and are developing their ability to recognise and convert improper fractions to mixed numbers, and vice versa. We are extremely proud of the children for their efforts throughout this topic as they continue to challenge and push themselves. Well done Year 5! Following the children's excellent writing and editing of their chapter 13 in English, the children have published their writing into books of their own which include illustrations to enhance their stories and a carefully designed front cover. The children have demonstrated a fantastic understanding of the features required to build suspense in their writing, as well as combining this with our previously developed understanding of direct speech and varied sentence types.

On Tuesday, Year 5 celebrated their Forest School Christmas Disco where we all enjoyed a hot chocolate and threw some fantastic shapes on the dancefloor. A big thank you again to Mrs Artingstall for organising such a fun-filled afternoon. Continuing our Christmas celebrations, we were thrilled to be invited to watch Year 2's Nativity performance. The children worked extremely hard and we were very impressed and grateful to be supporting them. As well as this, we have been practicing carols in preparation for our carol service on Tuesday. It would be lovely to see some of you there!

Question: What is a mixed number and how is this different from an improper fraction?

Year 6

Another busy week in Year 6 this week! In English, the children have been continuing to write the chapter, 'Freedom is in Peril'. In the lead up to this, we have been considering how we can integrate dialogue into a narrative to move the story forwards. Whilst writing, the children have been considering using dialogue purposefully. Mrs Gibson has been extremely impressed with the children's choice of vocabulary to describe when writing!

In Maths, we have been looking at measurement. This has largely focused on metric measures and converting between them, however we have also looked at imperial units of measure which are still used today.

In Science, we learnt about the scientist Carl Linnaeus and his contributions to biology. The children enjoyed learning about the Linnaean System of classification!

We have been preparing for the birth of Jesus in RE through our exploration of expectations during Advent. We learnt about the prophet Isaiah and what his expectations of the Messiah were.

Both the children and staff have loved reading 'A Christmas Carol' as part of the Just Read Project. It is a highlight of the day!
