

### **Nursery**

Nursery have had a lovely week.

We have continued our story 'The flying bath.' The children have worked hard bringing the story to life by creating actions. They have taken part in lots of continuous provision around the story and our topic water.

Unfortunately, sports day didn't go ahead this week but the children enjoyed lots of outdoor play and obstacle courses. They were super creative and began asking for additional equipment to create their own course.

In Maths, we have looked at what comes before and what comes after. The children have blown me away with how quickly they picked this up and have been using a lot of mathematical language during play such as "3 is one more" or "5 comes after 4."

This morning Nursery went to Reception for their transition morning. We had a few nervous faces however they really enjoyed being in Reception and loved meeting their new teachers. They are definitely ready to move up in September.

Question: Who does the flying bath help?

## Reception

We have had another great week in Reception! We have loved learning about the sea creatures from our new text "Commotion in the Ocean." We have been describing and creating our favourites. We visited the school fish tank to tell them all about the other sea creatures that live in the ocean.

In maths, we have continued our learning on repeating patterns and focused on the unit of repeat.

In RE we are learning about Jesus and how he is a good friend. In our last session, we shared food with our friends, and this week we designed and decorated biscuits to give to a friend.

We have had a lovely morning today in Year 1 with our new teacher. We are definitely Year 1 ready and cannot wait to move classes.

Question: What is the unit of repeat in this repeating pattern?



### Year 1

We have a had a lovely week completing our work and challenges. InEnglish we have enjoyed our new story "The Day the Crayons Quit". We have been writing sentences about how the crayons felt and we read a poem about what crayons could draw. We enjoyed finding the rhyming words and adjectives that describe.

In maths we have been partitioning two digits numbers and using mathematical symbols to compare two numbers. In science we have been monitoring our seeds in the poly tunnel. In RE we continue to focus on how we can change our hearts and used the story of Levi the tax collector to help us.

We had a lovely morning meeting our new teachers and are looking forward to continuing our learning journey next year.

### Year 2

We have had a wonderful week in Year 2.

We started our week with Sport Day on Monday. The children showcased their sporting talents and showed great support for each other. They also didn't let the rain dampen their spirits.

In Maths, we have now completed our time unit and are very proud of the children's' efforts to tell the time intermittently throughout the school day.

In English, the children have been thoroughly enjoying reading the Twits and completing their work. We have had some interesting character descriptions of Mr and Mrs Twit.

During our Geography lessons, we have continue to study Nigeria. We completed a data handling activity as we compared the climate of Manchester to the climate of Kano. We then explored the landscape of Nigeria where the children thoroughly enjoyed looking at the plants and animals of the country.

On Friday, the children had their transition morning with their new class teacher. They had an excellent morning and we know that they are more than ready to now go into Year 3.

#### Year 3

This week the children have really enjoyed our work on the book Stuart Little.

They wrote a LOST poster where they had to describe Stuart's friend, Margalo, a little wren who has become Stuart's friend.

In Maths, we have completed our unit on Money. This involved recognising how to change pounds into pence and vice versa. The work also included adding and subtracting amounts of money as well as multi-step problems which involved calculating amounts of money and giving change.

In History we have read all about Boudicca and the rebellion she led against the Romans. The children had to create a WANTED poster as one of the Romans, describing her and giving reasons as to why she needs to be arrested.

In Art, we started the unit, 'Telling Stories Through Drawing and Making.' This involved reading a poem and being inspired to draw. The poem we chose was all about Boudicca's final battle.

In Religion, we have continued with our unit on Choices. This week we looked in detail at the story of The Prodigal Son. The children had to think carefully about the events from the point of view of each character. We talked about the meaning behind this parable.

Question: If a book cost £2.20, how much change would I get from £5?

#### Year 4

In English this week, we have been drafting and writing diary entries from the point of view of Maxwell, in our text, The Lost Happy Endings! The children got the chance to get into the shoes of another character and had some brilliant vocabulary ready to use! We also prepared short hashtag summaries of different chapters to consolidate our knowledge of the text.

We are almost finished our topic of Decimals in Maths and are looking forward to pushing on and getting this finished over the next couple of weeks! The children have successfully been making a whole with tenths and hundredths.

In RE, we reviewed the sacrament of Reconciliation and different definitions of key vocabulary within the topic such as 'absolution' and 'confession'. In Geography, we learnt about the different activities you can do in the Alps as a tourist and had a look into the famous Lucy Walker and what made her famous as a mountaineer!

Lastly, the children all got to meet their new Y5 teachers on Friday and seemed to enjoy the time together, getting to know them and prepare themselves for the move up to UKS2! We wish the children lots of luck next year and know that they will all do brilliantly!

Question: what was Lucy Walker famous for wearing when she climbed the Matterhorn?

### Year 5

This week has been a wonderful week of celebration in Year 5. Firstly, the children were fantastic at our Sports' Day on Tuesday and demonstrated excellent sportsmanship, as well as a competitive spirit. 5LW also performed superbly at their assembly on Wednesday and the children received Ministry training from Father Celestine on Thursday. Finally, on Friday, the children enjoyed a fun-filled transition morning in Year 6 with their new teachers. We are confident they will be incredibly happy and successful next year.

In English, we have begun our unit of work on Chak De India! The children made predictions about the film, identified the main events, composed sentences with a wide variety of sentence structures and wrote a character description for Kabir Khan.

We also continued our Shape unit in Maths this week. The children identified position and direction in a range of contexts, defined and recognised acute, right-angle, obtuse and reflex angles, as well as estimating and measuring angles using a protractor. This work will continue next week.

Finally, in History, the children investigated the Black Death, identifying the symptoms, treatments and causes, as well as producing a fact file of information. Next week, the children will use this information to create double-page spreads, before moving on to Victorian medicine and the significance of vaccinations on our society.

### Year 6

It's been an extremely quiet week in Year 6 as the children have been visiting their various high schools across the week. We have loved hearing the children's stories upon their return and seeing their excitement for the next stage in their learning journey.

For the children who have been in school, we have been making props for the Year 6 production next week. A reminder that tickets for the show must purchased via Parent Pay.

On Tuesday, we had our final sports day! The children's behaviour and sportsmanship was outstanding and the event was enjoyed by all. A huge thank you to Mr Grantham for organising.

Next week, we have a number of special events for the Year 6 children taking place: Tuesday: Dress rehearsal of Beauty and the Beast (please can all costumes be in school for Tuesday).

Wednesday: Beauty and the Beast Production (1.30pm and 5pm).

Thursday: Leavers' Service with Emmaus Trust (please sign and return permission slips).
