

Reception

On Wednesday we had an assembly about the Tameside reading challenge - we are all excited to take part. Thursday we took part in our Sports Day, we had an amazing afternoon and today, we enjoyed St Stephen's Got Talent supporting our friends who were performing!

Year 1

This week in Year 1 we have had lots of fun! We started the week with some fantastic bouncing at the bounce-a-thon and concluded the day with fun at soft play in the afternoon. The children had so much fun. In Maths this week, we have been unitising, recognising and counting coins and notes. In English, we have continued to read our book 'The Day the Crayons Quit' and spot the rhyming words in a linked poem. In History, we have learnt lots about Victorian Schools. The children thought about what it would have been like, and showed empathy for Victorian children. In RE, we have written our own prayer to ask God to help us say sorry and forgive us. We revised the stories of Levi and Zacchaeus. We finished the week off with a bang at St Stephen's Got Talent. The range of talents were amazing! A big well done to RIver and Hazel in Year 1 - you were wonderful! Have a fantastic weekend, ready for our final week in Year 1!

Year 2

We have had a very busy week in Year 2! We have started our final D&T unit, making vehicles, and the children have practised using a handsaw and they have designed their own car, which they will make next week. In Maths, we have completed our Length & Height and the children have been measuring objects in centimetres and metres, and comparing and ordering different lengths. In R.E, we have been learning about our treasures and thinking about how we can treasure the world that God has created for us. In Geography, the children learnt about Abuja as the capital city of Nigeria and they were fascinated in this. We ended our week with St. Stephen's Got Talent and it was fantastic to see how many talented children we have at our school. Have a lovely weekend before we enter our final week of Year 2!

Year 3

This week Year 3 have continued with reading Stuart Little. The children have been delighted by Stuart's adventures. They had to plan and write a semi-formal letter of introduction in the first person from Stuart to a miniature girl who he comes across in another town.

In Maths, we have completed our unit on Money and begun our new unit on Time. The children have worked very hard to master time telling on analogue clocks. Our lessons also included reading Roman Numerals.

In History, we have continued with our work on Boudicca, answering questions on a newspaper report about how she rallied support from other Celtic tribes and fought the Romans.

In Art, the children looked at the poem about Boudicca again and picked out a detail from it which would give them the opportunity to experiment with colour, shape and expression. Some children chose to explore Boudicca's face in different roles: as a warrior, a mother, a queen as well as in victory and defeat. Luckily, on Thursday, the weather was dry enough for our Sports Day. The Year 3 children competed well and showed good sportsmanship.

Year 4

In school this week, there has been lots of exciting events. On Tuesday, we were invited to Year 6's Dress Rehearsal of Beauty and the Beast. The children really enjoyed the show and we were all so proud of the Year 6 children. On Thursday, it was Year 3 and 4's Sports Day. We kept our fingers crossed that the rain would hold off and we were so glad that it did.

Everyone had a great time and it was lovely to see the children cheering on their classmates. To finish off the week, on Friday morning we watched the annual St Stephen's Got Talent show. The children had so much fun watching the different acts and supporting Cleo, Dolly and Estee.

On Tuesday, Mr Meleady's class were visited by Father C who spoke to them about the ministries within the church. Next week, we are looking forward to Outdoor Classroom Day.

Year 5

Another exciting week here in Year 5. The children have been so excited on the run up to the summer break! A huge well done to our SSGT class representatives on their performances today. You should be so proud!

Continuing our work on 'ChakDe! India', the children have analysed the character of Kabir Khan through a role on the wall activity, highlighting important characteristics and commenting on what we can learn from his appearance, body language etc. Following this, the children have utilised a range of sentence types, including the use of parentheses, to write detailed character descriptions on what we have learnt so far.

In History, we have been continuing our learning on 'Medicine'. With focus on the Tudor period, the children have carried out some fantastic research to find information about diseases and illnesses, treatments and cures, the role of the barber surgeon, conditions of hygiene as well as information about the apothecary. Following this, the children composed some beautiful double page spreads presenting their findings. Well done Year 5! In Maths, we have been continuing our learning on 'Shape', with focus on angles. Building on our developing knowledge, the children have extended their learning, using known facts to support finding angles on a straight line, around a point as well as within shapes. The children have shown great resilience with this tricky concept and they should be very proud.

Year 6

A HUGE well done to our Year 6 children for their fantastic performance of Beauty and the Beast. We are so incredibly proud of all the children. Thank you to the parents/ carers who came to support the children across the two showings!

On Thursday, the children attended St Matthew's High School to participate in the first Emmaus Leavers' service. The children sang beautifully and the service was a wonderful celebration!

In class, we have been thinking about our transition to high school. We have completed transition booklets where the children researched their routes to high school, their new uniform and completed a high school scavenger hunt! We have also been looking at high school timetables and how to read these to ensure that no one misses a class!

Next week, we have both our Leavers' Mass and outdoor festival on Thursday. These are wonderful celebrations of the children's time with us at St Stephen's.
