

Nursery

What a busy week in Nursery!

We have loved exploring our outdoor area this week and took advantage of the fantastic weather we have had. The children enjoyed the mud kitchen, water area and dressing up and dancing on our stage area.

In our Maths sessions we have focused on colours especially red, blue and yellow we have loved finding objects around the classroom that are these colours.

In Phonics we have focused on the rhyme `1,2,3,4,5 once I caught a fish alive' we have loved singing this song, doing the actions and listening to different sounds.

Our topic work this week focused on our feelings and emotions we were confident to talk about emotions during circle time and we loved listening to the story 'Colour Monster' this helped us to think carefully about our emotions and the times when we might feel sad, excited and happy.

Question: When do you feel happy?

Reception

We have had another fantastic week in Reception!

We have continued reading our class book "What Makes Me a Me?" and we spoke about what makes us precious and unique. We followed this up in our Religion lessons.

On Monday, we had a visit from our special friends from Year 6. We enjoyed an afternoon of getting to know them.

In maths, we have continued our learning with 10-frames, recognising numbers and counting to 5. We also read the story 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' and talked about the number of characters.

In Phonics, we have been recapping last weeks sounds 's' 'a' 'p' and 't' and have learnt four new sounds 'i' 'n' 'm' 'd'. The children have been working really hard!

Question: What makes you precious?

Year 1

We have enjoyed another great week in year one. In English this week, we continued our work on Bumblebear. We completed speech bubbles for Norman and wrote sentences about different parts of the story. In Maths, we have been counting on from any number within 10 and have started looking at one more than. Children have been working hard to recognise numbers as words. In Science this week, we identified and labelled parts of the body and used mirrors to look closely at facial features. In History, we learnt about King Charles III and watched his coronation. In R.E, we discussed how families can be different but still care for eachother. Children have also been working more independently to complete their five rainbow challenges. We also had our first forest school session where children enjoyed some waggly dancing and playing the role of a bear or a bee. To finish the week, we had a lovely mass all about kindness.

Question: Who is our reigning monarch?

Year 2

We have had a very busy week in Year 2! In English, we have continued our sentence building work around I Want My Hat Back and started to identify sentences written in the first person. We use emojis to describe characters' emotions and the children shared some rich, exciting vocabulary. In Maths, we have been flexibly partitioning 2 digit numbers and Miss Leigh and Miss Leishman are very impressed with the children's fluency when doing this. In R.E, we studied Genesis 1 in depth and looked at the meaning of the scripture as believers. In Science, we looked at the diet of mammals and sorted animals into herbivores, carnivores and omnivores. We ended our week with a beautiful mass. Thank you to all our readers - you did an amazing job for your first time reading our bidding prayers.

Question: Why do you believe that God created the world?

Year 3

This week has been amazing. The children are really stepping up to the challenge of Year 3 work.

In English, we considered the bear's difficult dilemma of whether to stay in the forest or to leave for the city. The children had to use persuasive techniques to get the bear to move away from his habitat. On Monday both classes had Forest Schools sessions where they explored music-making in the woods. They created their own rhythms and created a composition with percussion instruments. Maths was more challenging this week as we looked at how three digit numbers could be partitioned in different ways. The children are becoming more confident in their understanding of numbers and what they are made up of. In Science, we continued to look at the Skeleton but this time we focused on the functions of different bones. The children had to decide whether bones are used for protection, support or movement.

In RE, we looked at the Holy Family as an example of how we should live in harmony. The children studied a painting of the Holy Family and wrote about the qualities they possessed.

Question: What is the function of the skull?

Year 4

It's been a lovely week in Year Four and we have been enjoying getting stuck in to our new topics.

In English, we finished reading The Legend of Rock, Paper, Scissors. The story has been very popular amongst the children. This week, we have been writing in character as one of the warriors. The children wrote some excellent warrior speeches and we are looking forward to performing them for each other next week.

We began our History topic 'How did slavery impact the achievements in Ancient Egypt?' We learnt some important facts about who the Ancient Egyptians were and even translated some hieroglyphics.

In Science, we grouped animals based on whether they were vertebrates or invertebrates. In maths, we continued our unit on place value. The children have been estimating using number lines and comparing numbers to 10,000.

In RE, we continued to learn about the genealogy of Jesus, specifically Abraham's story. The children wrote a letter to Abraham's son, Isaac telling him why it is important to trust in God.

Question: What is 34 of 1000?

Year 5

What a fantastic week we have had in Year 5 this week!

In English, we have been continuing our study of 'Saving The Butterfly'. The children have now established a good understanding of the symbolism presented in the book. They have used this to create excellent, contrasting diary entries from the perspective of the two characters. We were blown away by the language choices used.

During our Maths lessons, we have continued to look at place value to 1,000,000. We have explored powers of 10 and considered how we use place value to apply this to more difficult mathematical questions.

This week we have also started our History unit. This half term we will be studying the Ancient Maya. We have looked closely at where the Maya lived and labelled them on a map.

During our music lessons, 5LS have continued to learn how to play the tenor horn. Miss Seville was immensely proud of their efforts this week as they read musical notations to play a song with a backing track. 5LW will be looking at 'Living In A Prayer' in coming weeks. We can't wait to hear their efforts.

We have also taken part in our 'Celebration of the Word' session this week. The children showed great respect and created a prayerful atmosphere.

Finally, we would like to thank all those that were able to attend the 'Meet the Teacher' on Wednesday. The information was also sent out via Class Dojo and email for those that couldn't make it. We hope you found it useful.

Year 6

A fantastic week here in Year 6! A big thank you to all of the parents who came to watch 6DF's class assembly on Thursday and a huge well done to the children, they did a brilliant job of showcasing their work completed so far this half term as well as teaching us what it means to be compassionate - linking key individuals to our CARES values. Children in 6GB look forward to their class assembly this Thursday (26.09.24) and welcome their families to attend for a 9:05am start in the hall.

This week in English, we have been continuing our work on 'The Final Year', analysing the poem 'Oh, so ya wanna know about The Beast, right?' before planning and writing first-person narrative from the perspective of the Beast. Next week, we will edit our writing, with use of editing strips, before publishing these for display.

In Maths, we have expanded on our knowledge of place value with focus on powers of 10, comparing and ordering integers as well as rounding. The children have worked extremely hard and we are very proud of their achievements.

Next week, we have our **'Stay and Pray' sessions** which we welcome parents to attend. These will be child-led Celebration of the Word sessions which the children are looking forward to sharing with you. These will take place in your child's classroom and will last around 15 minutes. Parents can come into class with their children in the morning and the session will take place following registration at 8:55am. The dates are as follows:
