





Nursery

We have had a lovely week in Nursery.

We have really enjoyed our phonics lessons and activities on 'Incy Wincy Spider' this week. We can now confidently sing the rhyme with actions and recognise environmental sounds such as water running down a drain and birds singing.

Next week our phonics focus will be the nursery rhyme 'Humpty Dumpty'.

In Maths we have continued our work on colours, we looked at Green and Purple we have loved finding objects around the classroom based on these colours.

Our topic work this week focused on our homes, we talked about the different rooms in our houses and where we would find different items such as a table, computer, sofa and bath.

On Thursday we loved taking part in European Languages day, we learnt about the traditions in Spain, including flamenco dancing and learning the colours of the Spanish Flag. We even had a go at counting to 3 in Spanish!

Question: What are the two main colours of the Spanish Flag?

Reception

We have had another lovely week in Reception!

In maths, we have been learning about matching, sorting and comparing. The children have been collecting objects to sort using the vocabulary 'same' and 'different'.

In Literacy, we have continued reading our class book "What Makes Me a Me?"
We have been labelling the body parts and using our phonic knowledge to
hear, say and write the initial sounds.

In phonics, we have learnt the phonemes 'g' 'o' 'c' and 'k'. We have also learnt how to form these letters.

As we came to the end of the week, Reception really enjoyed answering the register in Spanish on languages day and wearing their own clothes.

Question: What are the three special things that we have on our prayer focus?

Year 1

We have enjoyed another great week in Year 1. In English this week, we continued our work on Bumblebear. We thought about Norman's daily planner and the children wrote sentences about the things Norman does at Bee School. In Maths, we have been counting on from any number within 10 and have started looking at one more/one less than. Children have been working hard to recognise numbers as words. In Science this week, we discussed the five senses, focussing on sight. Children worked scientifically to test how many bean bags they could throw into a box with both eyes open compared to with one eye open and then both eyes closed. In History, we looked at the life of Queen Elizabeth I and arranged some events chronologically In R.E, we wrote thank you prayers and and thought about how God cares for us. Children have also been working more independently to complete their five rainbow challenges.

Question: Can you count backwards from 10?

Year 2

We have had another lovely week in Year 2. In Maths, we have been coming to the end of our Place Value unit. The children have been ordering and comparing objects and numbers. In English, we have enjoyed acting out conversations between characters from 'I Want my Hat Back', and writing in speech bubbles in the first person. In Science, we continue to learn about animals and their needs for survival. In RE the children enjoyed choosing their favourite line from Psalm 139, and wrote a prayer showing thanks to God. As we came to the end of the week, Year 2 really enjoyed learning some greetings in Spanish on languages day, and their sweet treat from the Macmillan Coffee morning!

Question: Can you say Hello or Thank you in Spanish?

Year 3

This week was incredibly busy. On Thursday it was 'European Languages Day.'
In class, we looked at the festival of 'La Tomatina,' which takes place near
Valencia every year. The children had to design posters, advertising the event.
In English, we have planned and written a letter in first person as the bear,
writing home to his family and friends in the forest, describing his experiences
in the city. The children had to include a range of expanded noun phrases and
time adverbials.

In Maths this week we looked at placing numbers up to 1000 on a numberline, as well as comparing and ordering numbers.

The children particularly enjoyed their Guided Reading session this week as the text was an excerpt from 'The Magic Finger' by Roald Dahl. They compared this to other well-known stories by Dahl.

In RE this week we talked about prayer and the types of prayers we say. The children then wrote their own morning prayer, asking for God's guidance throughout the day. On Friday, each class held its own 'Celebration of the Word' in class.

Question: Which month is agosto in Spanish?

Year 4

Well done to the children for getting to the end of another great week in Year Four!

In English this week we have been using inverted commas to create direct speech based on our text 'The Legend of Rock, Paper, Scissors' and trying to incorporate our own expanded noun phrases into our writing.

In Maths, we have been learning how to compare and order numbers up to 10,000 as well as estimating on a number line to 10,000. The children also enjoyed revisiting their knowledge of Roman numerals, especially when we looked at the Roman numerals song and learnt the actions to help us remember what each one meant! We are still pushing on with our times tables too and would really appreciate your support to encourage the children to keep practising at home!

In science, we learnt about vertebrates and invertebrates and how to group different animals together. In history, we are continuing to learn about ancient Egypt and how Egyptian society was structured by analysing the pyramid of social hierarchy.

Question: what is the difference between a collective noun and a partitive noun?

Year 5

This week has been an extremely busy one - both inside and outside the classroom.

On Wednesday, we enjoyed a wonderful Forest School session with Mrs Artingstall. To begin the session, the children played a pairs game where they had to find their partner animal by asking questions about the animal's features. Mrs Artingstall then led the children in creating artwork using leaves, twigs, flowers, plants etc. to create a butterfly, rainbow or blanket. These items are integral to the story of 'Saving the Butterfly. Finally, the children participated in 'Rainbow' breathing. We are all incredibly proud of the children's achievements and their mature attitude to learning in the forest.

In Science, the children explored forces. They investigated both contact and non-contact forces, before learning, in detail, about the effects of friction on moving objects, gravity and air resistance. In particular, the children enjoyed predicting the results of a number of investigations, whilst also suggesting new investigations. This will stand them in good stead when they design their own parachute investigation next week.

Finally, on European Languages day, the children explored the work of Surrealist artist Joan Miro. Using this research, the children produced their own artwork in a Surrealist style.

Question: What are the common themes of Surrealism?

Year 6

It has been a busy week here in Year 6 and the children have worked incredibly hard! A massive thank you to all who attended the 'Stay and Pray' sessions earlier this week. We enjoyed having you for our celebration of the word and the children did a fantastic job at planning and delivering the sessions.

A huge well done to the children in 6GB who presented their class assembly yesterday with focus on our CARES values. Miss Birtles and Mrs Devine were very proud of all of the children and their hard work based around Derek Redmond, Pope Francis and their poetry writing in English. Again, a massive thank you to all who came to support the children.

This week, in English, we have successfully edited and published our narrative writing based around the poem, 'Oh, so you wanna know about The Beast, right?' in The Final Year. These have made for a fantastic read. We have also utilised our active reading skills to summarise poems in Part 3 into appropriate and effective hashtag summaries.

In Maths this week, we have concluded our unit on Place Value with rounding numbers to 10,000,000 before developing our understanding of negative integers. Next week, we look forward to beginning our unit on the four operations: addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

Question: What is 5,348,264 rounded to the nearest ten thousand?
