

Advent is the time when we make an extra effort to be more loving towards God and our neighbours. 

Nursery

This week in Nursery we have been very busy practicing our singing and dancing for our Christmas production 'A Wriggly Nativity'.

We are working so hard and we can't for you to watch our show!

In phonics this week we have been learning the rhyme 'Jack and Jill' we have loved learning the rhyming words and this weeks sound in our 'What's in the box?' game has been 't'- tiger, toast, teeth and teddy bear.

In Maths this week we have been learning about repeating patterns and have been able to talk about what makes a repeating pattern.

We loved celebrating Olive the Owls 2nd Birthday- we made cakes in the playdough area, had a tea party in the home corner and made birthday cards in the writing area. On Thursday afternoon we had a lovely forest school session with Mrs Artingstall based on Hedgehogs, the weather was good to us and we enjoyed learning facts about Hedgehogs, making hedgehogs from clay, listening to Percy the Park Keeper and the Hedgehog followed by a yummy hot chocolate!

Next week we are looking forward to Advent and learning about the First Christmas.

Reception

Where is the time going? The weeks are flying by!

This week marks our final week answering our big question of "Where is the Magic?" The children have secure knowledge of colour mixing, rhyming words, adjectives that describe texture and magical related words such as "mythical."

We have been learning about the composition of 4 and 5 this week. We have been using ten frames and double sided counters to help us. A really great game that we have played is called "Shake the Magic Cup"...

Put 4 or 5 double sided counters in a cup (1 side red, 1 side yellow - you could make these.)

Shake the cup well.

Empty the cup onto a flat surface.

Let "magic" choose how many red and how many yellow counters.

Use subitising skills to say how many red and how many yellow.

Say the STEM sentence __ and __ make 4 (or 5 - depending how many in the cup.)

The children have been working hard on their nativity. They are so excited for you to see it. Just a reminder that the clothing they need to go with their costumes need to be in school, in a labelled carrier bag (with your child's name.)

Year 1

This week has been very and productive. The children have worked hard to show how much they have learned in their English and Maths. We are very pleased with how much progress they are making in their phonics-thank you for all your home support. In RE we completed our work on Baptism and it was lovely to see and hear how much the children had remembered. We also enjoyed learning about Advent through our special Cafod assembly. We will explore the meaning of Avent over the coming weeks. We thoroughly enjoyed the music assembly on Wednesday and had great fun singing in class as part of the Singathon. The children continue to enjoy learning about the UK and are looking forwards to their Local area walk.

Year 2

A big well done to all children in Year 2 this week. You have worked so hard in your Maths and Reading assessments and the teachers in Year 2 are really proud of you! Alongside this, the children have been learning about Advent and enjoyed a CAFOD assembly to introduce us to our next RE unit. In Science, we have continued to learn about different materials and their suitability.

On Wednesday, we took part in our school Sing-a-thon and enjoyed a fantastic assembly from other year groups. We enjoyed taking part and singing throughou the day. The children have also been working so hard on their Nativity play, I'm sure you will hear lots of the songs at home! We ended the week with a lovely and relaxing Celebration of the Word.

Year 3

The children have worked extra hard this week as they completed English and Maths assessments.

Our new Geography unit is about geography of the UK. The children have enjoyed learning about the countries and cities that make up the UK. We also looked at the main rivers and mountains.

In English, we began our new book, 'The Dark' by Lemony Snicket. We began by looking at the opening picture of the book and inferring what might be happening. Then we began to look at the use of personification of the dark. On Thursday morning, Year 3 did their assembly for parents. The children performed beautifully as they acted, read and prayed. Some of the children from Mrs Bilic's class were proud to talk about their great grandparents who had contributed in some way to the war effort. Mrs Herbert's class treated us to two pieces on their ukuleles.

On Wednesday we had a whole school sing-a-thon which included a range of classes playing drums, ukuleles and brass instruments. At the end, we all sang together. It was great fun.

Year 4

This week has been Assessment Week in school. The children have been working hard to show how much they have learnt this term. We would like to say a huge well done for their effort and focus!

On Wednesday, school took part in a Sing-a-thon to raise funds for new instruments to enrich the children's learning in music. In assembly, the whole school came together in song. We were treated to performances from the school choir and from classes in Year 3, 4 and 5 who have been learning to play an instrument with our music teacher, Miss Chambers. 4DS performed Africa by Toto on the diembe drums.

In English, we began 'A Christmas Carol'. We discussed Charles Dickens as an author and also explored what life was like in Victorian England to add context to the story. The children are looking forward to reading the whole story.

In PE, the children have been enjoying learning to play basketball. In RE, we continued to learn about people that were called by God. We focused on the call of the apostles, reading the story from Mark's gospel.

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Year 5

This week has been a fabulous opportunity for the children to demonstrate how hard they have been working this term. They have all been extremely mature, putting maximum effort into their Maths and Reading assessments. We are so proud of them.

Another proud moment this week was 5LS's performance in the Singathon on Wednesday. They sang and played their tenor horns so beautifully. Well done 5LS!

In English this week we have continued to study Room 13. We analysed dialogue to identify whether it creates tension, advances the action or provides information about the characters. Following this, the children wrote their own dialogue between characters, using ellipses, pauses, short sentences and exclamations to create tension, as well as powerful language.

In Maths, we explored multiples, common multiples, factors and common factors, including finding the LCM and HCF. The children investigated common multiples and factors, making generalisations and explaining their conclusions using precise mathematical language.

Finally, in Geography, the children planned and conducted a class debate about the effects of urbanisation in Brazil. Using push and pull factors, they considered the pros and cons of moving from the countryside to the city. The children were so engaged and articulated their points well.

Year 6

Another brilliant week here in Year 6! The children have been working extremely hard across all areas of the curriculum; Mr Fitch and Miss Birtles are very proud of them.

This week, in English, we have continued our learning on Letters from the Lighthouse by Emma Carroll. We first begun by analysing features of a narrative text, highlighting conjunctions, parenthesis, dialogue, fronted adverbials and the varied use of punctuation - including semi-colons. Following this, we revisited our learning from Year 5 and consolidated our understanding and accurate use of direct speech, punctuating this with developing accuracy. The children worked hard to rewrite existing dialogue with focus on moving the narrative forward and these have made for an interesting read.

In Mathematics, the children have continued developing their understanding of fractions. Year 6 have worked hard to add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions by integers as well as by other fractions. We have even begun applying this understanding to mixed questions before finding fractions of amounts. The children have shown great resilience to this and are beginning to develop in confidence in their processes and application of methods. Well done Year 6!
