



The children have enjoyed learning about the First Christmas and the important people who were there. They have been talking about the story and retelling it in our class Worship Area.

We have enjoyed taking the travelling Nativity home with us this week and we will continue to do this over the next couple of weeks.

We have been extremely busy practising for our 'Wriggly Nativity!' and are very excited to perform it to you next Tuesday 10th December at 9.30am in the School Hall.

On Thursday we enjoyed a Stay and Play at Nursery, It was lovely to see so many of you come and for you to experience all the wonderful activities we do at Nursery in our lovely Nursery environment- we hope you enjoyed the story Simon Sock!

There will be more Nursery Stay and Plays in the New Year arranged based the Storytime Maths programme.

Reception

We cannot believe that it is our Reception Nativity next week! The children have been working so hard and we are sure that you will love the show.

In Literacy, we have started to explore our new class text "Jesus' Christmas Party."

We read the story, spoke about the people in the story and the important roles they played in the safe arrival of Jesus. We then wrote story summaries. Next week, we will be using our talk for writing skills to retell and sequence the story.

In maths we have been thinking about shapes with 4 sides. Can you remember the names of the shapes?

In RE we performed our own Baptism service (see class dojo for photos.) The children have really started to understand the meaning of Baptism and being welcomed into God's family. Next week, we will be starting our advent focus. This half term's VIPs came to an end this week. Thank you so much to everyone who came. It was lovely to chat with you about your wonderful children. VIPs will begin again after the half term.

Year 1

Our week in Year 1 started with a walk around Droylsden as part of our geography topic. The children could recognise and identify local landmarks. In English this week, the children have been writing their own Supertato story with different characters. They wrote the beginning, middle and end of the story using their story maps and produced some lovely pieces of work. In Maths, we have been learning about 2D and 3D shapes. Children have been identifying them as well as sorting them. In RE we have been learning about Advent and how it is a time for waiting and preparing. We have looked at the symbolism of the Advent Wreath. Some children have taken home our travelling nativity. Please do send photos of the children praying at home via Dojo. In Science, we have been identifying and sorting different materials such as wood, metal, and plastic.

Year 2

Year 2 have worked extremely hard this week. We have now completed our assessments and we are so proud of the effort the children put into these and the resilience they displayed.

We have now started our new text in English, Little Robin Red Vest. This week, the children have read and answered questions about the story and started to look at how apostrophes are used for contractions.

In Maths, we have started to subtract 2 digit numbers not crossing a boundary and learn methods to support us in doing this.

In R.E, we read Isaiah 9:2-6 and thought about how we can prepare for the coming of Jesus. We also learnt about the Annunciation of Mary and the children described the words and actions during this.

In Geography, we learnt about the 8 compass points and we located continents and oceans using these.

In Science, we learnt about how different objects can be made out of different materials and why people might choose which material is most effective.

Year 3

This was a great week in Year 3.

On Monday and Tuesday, the Year 3 classes had their 'Stay and Pray' sessions. We were delighted by the numbers of parents and grandparents who attended. The focus was Advent. The children enjoyed having their families with them and did a lovely job of reading and writing prayers.

In English this week, we continued with our work on 'The Dark' by reading the rest of the book and discussing its meaning. The children had to make their own sentences using a range of conjunctions.

This week in RE we started our work on Advent by thinking about how we prepare for the coming of Jesus. We explored what a Jesse Tree is as well as reading some beautiful verses written by the prophet Isaiah.

We are also marking Advent by opening a door of the 'Reading Rocks' calendar every day. This means we are introduced to an author talking about one of his/her books each day.

In Maths we have completed our unit on Addition and Subtraction and have begun work on Multiplication and Division.

Year 4

Well done to all of the children for getting to the end of another productive week, we have been very busy and are working hard to get to the end of our learning before we break up for the Christmas holidays.

In our English lessons, we are studying 'A Christmas Carol' by Charles Dickens. We have discussed the front cover and suggested different keywords that come to mind and have read through the first two chapters, focusing on the character of Scrooge. We have used different adjectives, expanded noun phrases and similes to describe Scrooge and have compared and contrasted different pictures from the film adaptation using our knowledge of subordinating clauses.

In Maths we are continuing on with our hefty topic of Multiplication and Division, looking at the 11 and 12 times tables and learning how to multiply three numbers together. The children have also been revising their 7 times tables in class too so please do keep encouraging them to practise their times tables on TTRs ahead of the MTC in Spring.

We have had a little look into different states of matter in Science as we have begun our new Chemistry topic and have looked at the main rivers in our world in Geography.

This week, 4DS and 4SM took part in their class RE retreats with Mrs Farmer and really enjoyed learning more about Advent and what this time of year means. The got creative and painted their own representation of Advent and wrote their own prayers to God

Year 5

We've had a great week in Year 5 this week.

In Maths, we have been continuing our multiplication and division unit by exploring common factors. This has highlighted to the children the importance of knowing their times table facts at speed and they are encouraged to regularly access TTRockstars at home.

In English, we have been discussing formality and how to create it in our writing. As part of our Room 13 unit, we have identified main events which have involved two of the main characters. We have then written school reports for each character. During Science we have been exploring Earth and Space. The children have worked hard to learn scientific terminology for celestial bodies in our Solar System and looked at distinguishing features of each of the planets.

In Religion, we have been discussing meaning of the vows within a marriage ceremony. We have also considered the role of a priest and created our own job advertisements,

Question: What is the order of the planets?

Year 6

Another busy week in Year 6! In Maths, we completed our Fractions unit by looking at finding the whole when given a fraction of an amount. We then progressed on to looking at metric units of measurement. We explored which units are appropriate and how to convert between different units.

In English, we wrote our own endings for a chapter in which Budmouth Point was being attacked. The children demonstrated their imagination and accuracy with punctuation to create some brilliant pieces of writing! In Science, we looked at how microorganisms are classified. We then looked at Carl Linneaus, who was the first scientist to create a classification system for animals and plants.

Our R.E. work focused on the sacrament of Holy Orders and the process that would-be priests need to go through in order to be ordained.

Question: Why didn't Carl Linneaus include microorganisms in his classification system?
