

Wednesday 29th January 2025



THE GOSPEL IN CHURCH Sunday 2nd February 2025



When the day came for them to be purified as laid down by the Law of Moses, the parents of Jesus took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord and, in accordance with the Law, they offered two young pigeons in sacrifice. Now in

Jerusalem there was a man named Simeon. He was an upright and devout man and it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death until he had set eyes on the Christ of the Lord. Prompted by the Spirit he came to the Temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the Law required, he took him into his arms and blessed God; and he said: "Now, Master, you can let your servant die in peace, just as you promised; because my eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared for all the nations to see, a light to enlighten the pagans and the glory of your people Israel." Jesus' parents took him back to Nazareth where Jesus grew to maturity, and he was filled with wisdom; and God's favour was with him.





Nursery

This week at Nursery we have celebrated Chinese New Year-The Year of the Snake. The children have engaged in all the activities, making dragons, creating snakes, saying hello in mandarin, enjoying messy play with cornflour and mark making with chopsticks, number sequencing in relation to the 'Great Race' and being very creative (making some super slithery snakes!).

We have enjoyed learning all about how the New Year is celebrated and loved watching dragon dances and parades! We took part in a Yoga session based on the 'Great Race' and danced to Music to celebrate.

In Maths we have continued our learning on the number four, we have loved subitising and recalling numbers to four.

In Phonics we have enjoyed the rhyme 'Baa, Baa Black Sheep' we have also been learning words which start with the 'o' sound such as 'Orange and Otter.'

Reception

What great week we have had in Reception celebrating Chinese New Year. The children have thoroughly enjoyed learning about the Lunar New Year and why it is celebrated. In Literacy, the children have been following instructions to make chinese noodles. In Maths, we have been subitising, comparing mass and finding a balance. We have been thinking of the vocabulary 'compare' 'mass' 'heavier' 'lower' and 'balance scales'. In phonics, we have learnt two new sounds - 'air' and 'er'. We have a practised writing words with double letters along with the tricky words, 'are' 'sure' and 'pure'.

A huge well done to Mrs Ellison's class for their amazing assembly.

Year 1

This week we have completed our work on Unplugged by writing our own narratives. We have also started our new text -Man on the Moon and have enjoyed retelling the story with our story maps. We have been consolidating our understanding of numbers to 20 by comparing them and ordering them. We continue to look at animal groups in science and have been learning about fish, amphibians and reptiles. Our RE lesson helped us to understand the work of CAFOD and how they bring good news to those who are suffering. We continue to learn about the history of flight through the lives of the Wright brothers. We enjoyed music and playing the glockenspiel.

Task: Talk about different animal groups and their differences

Year 2

In Year 2 this week, the children have been very productive.

At the start of the week, the children enjoyed a whole year group PE session where we engaged in a carousel of exercise and games.

In English, the children have been really impressing us, writing some fantastic character descriptions including adverbs and expanded noun phrases.

In Maths, we continue our unit on Money, this week the children have been comparing amounts of pounds and pence, and adding pence to make up a pound. In RE, we have been reflecting on our unit all about special books, and have been understanding what makes the Gospel stories special to us.

In History, we have been reflecting on the effects of the efforts made by the Suffragettes, and learnt about some significant actions they took, such as hunger strikes to fight for their cause.

Question: How many pence make up a pound?

Year 3

In Year 3 this week we have begun our new English unit based on the books 'Greta and the Giants' and the 'Little People Big Dreams' book about Greta Thunberg. The children are already enjoying discussions about our natural environment and endangered species.

In Maths this week we began a new unit on multiplication. This unit looks at multiplying two digit numbers. The children will initially look at a range of visuals which help them to understand the process before learning more formal methods.

In Science we have come to the end of our unit on Rocks. Our last lesson involved a fair test. The children performed an experiment which tested which types of rocks sunk and which floated when placed in water.

The children are all enjoying their regular singing lessons provided by the diocese. They have been practising the hymn 'Shine Jesus Shine' for the Welcome mass on Sunday.

Question: what is 24 x 10?

Year 4

In Year Four this week, we have been continuing our English unit based around the novel 'The Miraculous journey of Edward Tulane'. The children created their own character, a toy just like Edward and wrote an explanation text all about how their toy is made, their appearance, their personality traits and any other unique features. We then began researching the RMS Queen Mary which is the setting of a key moment in the story. We plan to use our research to write a non-chronological report all about the legendary ocean liner.

In Maths, we began to use formal methods of multiplication to multiply 2 and 3 digit numbers by a 1 digit number. The children have picked up the method really well and now have another tool to help them multiply larger numbers.

In Science, we began our unit on 'Sound'. We thought about what sound is and how it travels. To support our learning, we made telephone cups and investigated how they work.

Question: How does sound travel?

Year 5

This week culminated in the creation of our vegetarian meals on Thursday. The children loved preparing and cooking falafel, with an accompanying sauce. Following this, they evaluated their work, identifying what they liked/ disliked about the look and taste of their meal; suggesting how it could be improved and recognising the problems they faced in preparing and cooking falafel.

In Art, the children studied the work of Kittie Jones (a landscape artist from Edinburgh). They explored her artistic process, using a range of media, from pencil sketches to ink washes, charcoal to pastels and finally paint. They used their creativity to make visual notes about her work, which will be used to inspire their own landscape paintings next weeks.

As part of our learning in Maths this week, we used chocolate swiss rolls to convert improper fractions to mixed numbers and vice versa. We then compared and ordered fractions in a range of ways, finding common denominators and numerators, before applying our understanding to problem-solving.

Fronted adverbials have been a focus in English this week. Using the animated film 'Monkey Symphony' as stimuli, the children used colourful semantics to create sentences, incorporating fronted adverbials of time and manner. The children then applied their understanding of a range of sentence structures to independent written pieces. Next week, we will begin our study of Brightstorm by Vashti Hardy.

Question: What is mixed media and how can it be used in the artistic process?

Year 6

This week, Year 6 have completed another round of mock SATs. The children have all done their absolute best and are now showing that they are comfortable with the setup and expectations around the SATs.

Aside from this, we have been busy looking at decimals in Maths. This started with familiarising ourselves with the place value involved, moving on to rounding and then adding and subtracting decimals.

In English, we have concentrated on Nina, a character in The House With Chicken Legs. We looked at her feelings and emotions as the story progressed and then produced a monologue from her perspective.

In R.E., we have looked at how to navigate the bible in order to locate scripture. This involved using the contents page, understanding whether books were located in the old or new testament and then working out which chapters and verses were relevant. In Science, we have continued to look at circuits, with our focus on varying circuits this week. We explored the impact that adding or removing components has on a circuit.

Question: Is the book of Matthew in the old or new testament?
