Just a few reminders as we move into the final week of this term:

- **Beginning of the school day.** Please remember that the classroom doors open at **8:40am** and your children can enter school from this time. Registers are taken at **8:55am** and if children arrive after this time they will receive a late mark. You should use children's classroom doors up to 9:00 am as their class teacher can place a late mark in the register until 9:00 am. However, after this time, the entrance gates will close and children should be brought to the school office where they will be signed in as late after the register closes. Punctuality is so important and a prompt start to the school day is vital.
- School ties. We are seeing an increasing number of children not wearing school ties. Please remember that this is our school uniform. Full school uniform is part of our 'world class basics' so please do ensure your child is in full school uniform each day. Please use half term holiday to purchase a new tie from the uniform shop if your child does not have one I would greatly appreciate it. We have placed an order with our uniform company and hopefully will have a stock of school ties available to purchase soon. We will let you know when they are here.

- Half term holidays. Our mid-term break begins on Friday 18th February and school reopens on Monday 28th February.





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Nursery

In nursery this week we have been hunting for dinosaur fossils! We even made our own using salt dough. We have been exploring with paint, creating dinosaur footprints and painting freely on our easel.

In our outdoor area, we searched high and low for dinosaurs, talking about what they are called and what they ate. We then sorted them into carnivores and herbivores.

Reception

We have had a wonderful week. We are happy and excited by the news that Mr Lavin is our new Headteacher. Well done to Mr Lavin! This week we have really enjoyed looking at maps of Droylsden and locating our own houses on our own individual maps. We had to come to the rescue of the vegetables as the evil pea from the book supertato had frozen them in blocks of ice! Luckily the children found a way to free them. We also made our own rain clouds.

Through story we have talked about things that make us feel happy and we have listened to relaxing music that made us feel peaceful. Thank you for sending in the grandparent "interviews".

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Year 1

It's been another exciting week in year I. We went outside to play 'The Beanbag Game'. This helped us to consolidate our knowledge and understanding of counting in 25,55 and IOS and we had great fun counting up our scores. In English this week we have continued with our work on a non-fiction text about Dinosaurs. We have learned all about imperative (bossy) verbs and used them in our writing. We had to write a set of instructions for looking after a pet Dinosaur. In our R.E work we discussed the story of 'The Presentation of Jesus in the Temple' and also when Jesus got lost in the Temple. We were able to relate it to our own real-life experiences of getting lost. In our art lesson we looked at the work of Kandinsky and painted colour wheels in his style. We listened to Latin music and used instruments to keep the pulse in our music session. As it's been 'Mental wellbeing' week we have done activities that have been fun. For example we made a treasure chest and put inside all the things we are good at.

Year 2

Year 2 have been working very hard this week . In English we have been planning and writing our own narratives based on the story of Pretty by Canizales. The children have been very imaginative with their settings and characters.

In our maths lessons we have been learning to read analogue clocks to the quarter hour. Next week we will move on to tell the time at 5 minute intervals.

We completed our RE unit on Books and shared some of our favourite Gospel stories. We also had a lovely session with Mrs Farmer on our Year 2 retreat. We celebrated God's love through song, art and prayer.

Encourage your child to try and read the time to 15 intervals.

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Year 3

What a lovely week in year 3! We have been celebrating Children's Mental Health Week by participating in daily meditation sessions. We have also been learning 'Lean on Me' by Bill Withers, which recognises how we can support each other in times of need. Through Mr Lavin's assembly, we identified how we could make a difference to someone this week and have been completing random acts of kindness throughout the week.

In Design Technology, we investigated a range of pneumatic systems and created one of our own, using tubing, a syringe and balloon. We then tested our design ideas for our Moving Monster before settling on a final design. We can't wait to create our Moving Monsters next week. Thank you for all the donations of boxes, tubes and washing-up bottles.

Year 4

What a busy week in Year 4! We began our History unit 'Anglo-Saxons and Scots' this week and to support our learning, we read the Anglo-Saxon myth 'Beowulf'. As part of our English lessons, we used the myth to write some Kennings poems about the monster 'Grendel'. The children really enjoyed generating gruesome vocabulary and were able to use all of these fantastic ideas to write some brilliant poems. In addition, we drew some sketches of our interpretation of Grendel. We have some extremely talented artists in Year 4!

In Maths, we began learning about equivalent fractions. Although some found this difficult at first, with a bit resilience and some dividing of chocolate cake they were soon grasping the concept. As part of Mental Health Awareness Week, we took part in daily mindfulness activities and the children had great fun 'dressing to express to finish the week off.

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Year 5

This week in Year 5 we have started our exciting new Art topic. We are looking at the work of Roy Lichtenstein and his Pop Art creations. We have analysed and researched him this week. Over the next few lessons, the children will be creating their own pieces. In English we have focused on grammar focuses (apostrophes) and related this work to our Chak De India story. In maths we have completed our multiplication unit and even tested out our knowledge on some practice SAT's questions. With it being mental health week, we have done lots of work centred around growing as people and understanding ourselves and our emotions. We have created poems, produced art work and participated in a live online lesson through the BBC.

Year B

This week, Year 6 have been combining their usual learning with some Wellbeing activities to mark Children's Mental Health Week. This has included meditation, artwork and nature walks, along with discussions on having a positive mindset and how we can help others to grow.

We have continued our work on fractions, with the children practising comparing and ordering fractions with different denominators. In French, we have been continuing our focus on school,

with the children learning to say which subjects	
they study and the time of the lesson. We have	
also started our History topic (World War II -	
The Front Line) by looking at a timeline of the key	
events through the war.	C
