Nursery

What a busy and exciting start our new book which is Walter's Wonderful Web.

We have been on a minibeast hunt and looked at insects in detail, counting their legs and naming them. We have had a focus on 2D shapes this week; naming them, identifying their properties and matching them to Walter's webs.

In the allotment this week we all planted and watered runner beans. We also did a search of our allotment and talked about the changes that we could see from before the Easter break.

Reception

We were very excited to welcome the children back after the Easter break. This week has been all about minibeasts. It was amazing to see all of the minibeasts that were in our bug house. We found spiders, snails, woodlice and ants. We are observing our tadpoles as they continue to grow. We think that they will be froglets very soon! Ask your child to tell you about the life cycle of a frog.

In literacy our text is 'The Woolly Bear Caterpillar' by Julia Donaldson.

Ask your child to tell you about this story.

In mathematics we are becoming wizards at doubling.

Year 1

It has been lovely to see the children back after the Easter holidays, bursting with news of all the fun things they did. Our highlight this week included:-

- Learning about Easter and Jesus rising from the dead.
 - Writing our own stories based on the Queen's hat.
- Asking our Victorian doll questions about life in a Victorian school.
 - Learning about fractions- halves and quarters.
 - Learning about amphibians.

We are making a slight change to our book change days. Books will now be changed on Mondays and Thursdays. Children now reading more extended books will have them changed on Mondays only. This is to allow more time to develop fluency. Please read each book with your child at least three times and write in their reading diary.

Enjoy the bank holiday weekend. Question: What is an amphibian?

Year 2

Year 2 have had a busy and productive start to the new term. In maths we have been reviewing our understanding of addition of two-digit numbers and as teachers we have been very impressed with the learning the children have retained from earlier in the year.

In English we have used our book, Mr Bunny's Chocolate Factory as a stimulus for our writing. The children have researched how chocolate is made and written some detailed explanation texts.

In science we have been looking at the findings of our experiment into what plants need to grow well. We have also been looking at seed germination.

In our geography topic we have been using a compass to describe the locations the continents and ocean in relation to each other.

In RE we shared the story of the Resurrection of our Lord and In RSE we continue our work on our uniqueness.

Ask your child how chocolate is made.

Year 3

This week, in Maths, we have been working on using formal written methods for the addition of 2 and 3 addends. We used the part/whole model, bar model and dienes equipment to calculate using hundreds, tens and ones. In English, we began our new text Egyptian Cinderella by Shirley Climo by analysing the text and comparing it to the traditional fairy tale. This text fits perfectly with our History topic this half term and the children are very excited to immerse themselves in all things Egyptian. In RSE our topic is 'Jesus My Friend.' We considered what the parable of the Prodigal Son teaches us about God and mind mapped the important ingredients for a healthy friendship. We are learning about the seasons of the year in French and will be building French phrases and sentences as the unit progresses. On Thursday, as part of World Dance Day, we participated in an online workshop led by Amasing where we sang and danced with over 120 schools from across the country. The children particularly enjoyed the 'Queen' medley at the end of the session and rocked away on their air guitars.

Question – How do you say Winter, Spring, Summer and Autumn in French?

Year 4

With our visit from Ofsted this week, the children did a fantastic job of sharing all of the fabulous things they have been doing and excelled themselves with their impeccable behaviour.

Miss Scaife's class also welcomed a new member this week. All of the children have ensured that she feels welcome and she has been a delightful addition to the classroom.

In maths, we finished off our work on decimals. The children applied knowledge from earlier in the year to help them round decimals to the nearest whole number. Why not ask them to help you round your weekly food shop to the nearest pound?

Question: What was found at Sutton Hoo?

Year 5

It has been yet another busy week in Year 5 this week.

Within English, we have continued to study the act of Philippe Petit and empathised with him by writing a first-person account of his wire walk between the twin towers. The children have enjoyed studying the trailer for the film and now have a grasp of the extremity of the act.

During Maths, we have progressed with our knowledge of fractions. Together we have consolidated our knowledge of comparing and ordering fractions, as well as converting mixed number and improper fractions.

Additionally, within our Humanities topic, we have completed our Tudors unit (to the dismay of many of our children) and now started our Geography topic. The initial lessons have been considering time zones and the meridians.

Finally, as you know, at the start of this week, we had our OFSTED visitors in school and Year 5 were fantastic! The children conducted themselves brilliantly (as we knew they would) and were eloquent and honest when in discussions with the inspectors. We are proud of you Year 5 and we really did pull together as a team. #teamststephens.

Year B

We've had a non stop first week back in Year 6!

In Maths, we have been revising the key properties of shapes alongside arithmetic revision. The children are really pulling together all of their learning in preparation for the upcoming SATs tests- Well done Year 6!

In English, we began our new text, Cicada. The children were hooked as they followed the story- there were many gasps of excitement and shock! We are looking forward to continuing this text next week.

In history, the children have listened to Churchill's speeches and analysed features that made them powerful and motivating. We have also learn about D-Day and made links to our prior learning about Pearl Harbour.

As the SATs approach, if your child would like to complete additional pages of their CGP books they can. The children might wish to focus upon an area they would like more practise with.
